HOBGOOD FACIAL PLASTIC SURGERY

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Otoplasty Aftercare Instructions

YOU WILL NEED TO PURCHASE: SKI BAND OR HEAD BAND, PRESCRIPTIONS.

Day of Surgery

- 1. Shampoo your hair, wash your face, neck and ears thoroughly.
- 2. NOTHING TO EAT, DRINK (including water), OR SMOKE AT LEAST EIGHT (8) HOURS PRIOR TO SURGERY IF BEING PERFORMED UNDER GENERAL ANESTHESIA IN A SURGERY CENTER.
- 3. If your procedure will be performed using local anesthesia (in-office), you may need to check-in to the office early to apply topical numbing cream one (1) hour before your procedure start-time.
- 4. Take medications as prescribed/directed if applicable.

After Surgery

- 1. Relax and elevate your head and shoulders on two (2) pillows.
- 2. Take pain medication as prescribed every four to six (4-6) hours, if needed. If you have no pain, do not take the pain medication. If you have minimal pain, you may take Extra Strength Tylenol.
- 3. After surgery, the doctor will place molded cotton around your ears. He will then wrap your ears in a turban-like manner. If your bandage feels tight, you may *slightly* loosen the tape at the top of your bandage. **DO NOT remove the bandage**. This dressing will remain in place for two (2) days.
- 4. You may shower, but **DO NOT get the dressing wet**. **DO NOT shampoo your hair until instructed to do so by our office.**
- 5. Once your dressing is removed, your incision should be cleaned using a Q-Tip with hydrogen peroxide, followed by antibiotic ointment three (3) times daily.
- 6. Avoid strenuous activities or heavy lifting for one (1) week.
- 7. After your initial dressing is removed, you should wear a ski band/headband as much as possible for two (2) weeks. The ears should be protected during vigorous activity.

Other Instructions

- 1. Be aware of your diminished hearing, especially in potential hazardous situations, i.e. driving. Driving a vehicle may be resumed 48 hours after surgery, providing your hearing is adequate and you are not taking any prescription pain medication.
- 2. After surgery, there is usually mild staining of dressing during the first night after your procedure, however, please call the office immediately if you experience:
 - Complete loss of hearing
 - Blood on the dressing
 - Temperature elevations (fever)
 - Extreme pain and/or one side being significantly more painful than the other

General Information

- 1. Your ears will be swollen, bruised and red in appearance, and may be abnormally thick and/or large for about ten (10) days after surgery.
- 2. Some numbness over the ears may persist in the immediate post-operative period. This usually resolves within two to three (2-3) months.
- 3. NO SWIMMING for ten (10) days.
